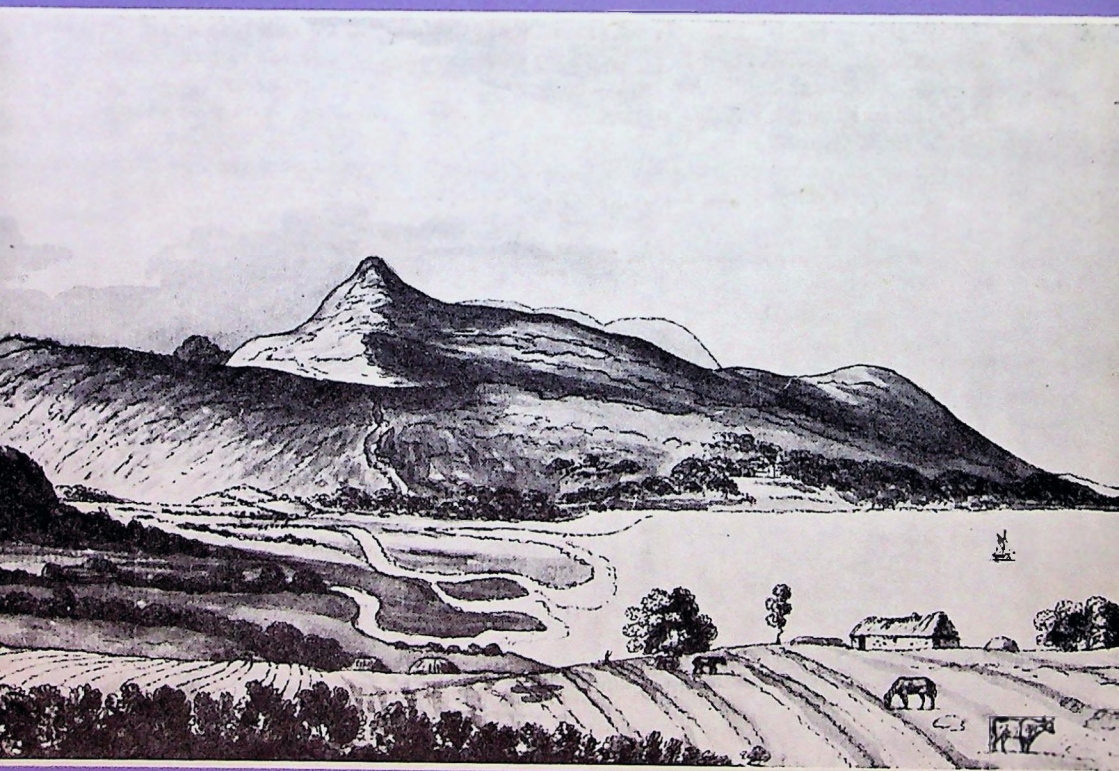

The notes include first-hand reports on fieldwork and research, and transcriptions from the School's manuscripts and tape-recorded archives. There is also an annual bibliography.
